- B. How is your educational setting preparing for the Portrait of a Graduate initiative?
  - i. Lancaster sponsored a full day for administrators to discuss and look at practices already in place; seeking articulation from K-12
  - ii. Lyndonville is starting with the 6 attributes and asking what this will look and sound like in practice
  - iii. Conceptually, in support of the spirit of the initiative, but questions/concerns:
    - 1. How will districts keep track of students' progress toward graduation? (Brockport Central Schools are using an innovative badging system)
    - 2. How to translate the high school transcript for higher ed?
    - 3. Validity and reliability of evaluation measures? How to calibrate proficiency?
    - 4. Equity of implementation across districts?
    - 5. Impact on teacher workload?
    - 6. Expense of implementation?
